2. Project Summary and Objectives

The Project will construct a new two-lane road approximately 14.3 km long, in a key section of the East–West Highway that skirts the port city of Batumi. Total Project Cost: USD 315.2 million; USD 114.0 million (AIIB), EUR 108.2 (ADB), and USD 87.2 million (Govt. of Georgia).

The Project objective is to improve regional connectivity and efficiency of road transport along the East-West Highway in Georgia.

5. Project Implementation Update

1. The overall implementation is significantly behind schedule with physical progress of 56.7% as of Feb 28, 2021.

2. ADB/AIIB is considering a 12-month Extension of Time (EOT) to Dec 2021 (total 16 month EOT from original completion date of Aug 2020) as per Road Directorate's request.

3. During joint Mid-Term Review with ADB in July 2021, EOT request including project cost increase will be finalized.

Financial Management:

The latest audit report for year 2019 was submitted and shared with AIIB this January in accordance with extension arrangement due to Covid-19 impact. The audit report was jointly reviewed by ADB and AIIB, and comments were provided to the borrower.

6. Status of the Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM)

The Local Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) was established on 14 Jun 2016 to receive written as well as verbal grievances. The GRM is functioning.

A total of 173 persons have submitted 20 categories of grievances to the GRC out of which 93 grievances have been resolved as of Feb 28, 2021. 37 cases are requests for inclusion of their residential structures or land plots in the acquisition list, out of which 19 cases are finalized. 57 cases are applications compensation for for damage to their assets due to construction activities, out of which 21 cases are finalized and 17 cases are from tunnel blasting zones. 29 cases relate to dissatisfaction due to disturbance by noise/vibration and dust out of which 13 cases were resolved. 11 cases are from the tunnel N2, N3 and N4 areas.
